Collection Scope and Content Summary

Florence G. Sammet Rothschild was a Barnard College student and correspondent to the *Evening Mail* and the *Globe* newspapers. Her scrapbook contains clippings of her writing on events and life at Barnard during the year 1908.

Of particular interest are her articles describing a talk given by Socialist advocate Mrs. Rose Pastor Phelps-Stokes and visits from Suffragists hoping to recruit Barnard women to the cause. The scrapbook also contains numerous write-ups of plays and social gatherings that took place

at Barnard College during the year 1908, including a minstrel show put on by Barnard College women. Some clippings are dated personally by Rothschild.
