**Abstract:** Kenneth Waltz (1924-2013) was a professor and scholar

of Political Science and International Relations. Waltz was influential in helping to shape the field of International Relations and published extensively. The collection contains materials related to his scholarship and teaching, including many handwritten notes alongside articles and newspaper clippings on topics within International Relations, as well as a

small amount of personal material and correspondence.

# **Biographical / Historical**

Kenneth Waltz (1924-2013) was a Columbia University Professor and influential scholar of Political Science and International Relations. He received a B.A. from Oberlin College in Economics and a PhD in Political Science from Columbia. In the middle of his studies he served in the Army during both World War II and the Korean War. He then taught at Columbia until 1957, after which he held positions at Swarthmore College, Brandeis University and the University of California, Berkeley. In 1997 he returned to Columbia as an adjunct professor of

Political Science and a Senior Research Scholar at the Arnold A. Saltzman Institute for War and Peace Studies.

# **Biographical / Historical**

Waltz was influential in helping to shape the field of International Relations. He is best known for his theory of neorealism, also called structural realism, which explains how states behave and interact with each other within the international system. Waltz's two most successful books included Man, the State, and War: a Theoretical Analysis (1959) and Theory of International Politics (1979). From 1987-1988 he was the President of the American Political Science Association and in 1999 won the association's James Madison award. His work later in life focused on nuclear weapons and he held a controversial position that nuclear proliferation would prevent nuclear war. Waltz continued to teach and write on the subject until his death in 2013.

## **Summary**

### **Scope and Contents**

Series I contains Waltz's research and writing from his graduate work through his later career. Much of the series consists of files of research on specific topics in International Relations and Waltz's collection of articles by other scholars. Some of this material relates directly to his published work, also contained in the series, while some is more generally on topics connected to studies in the field. A number of the topics covered here are also referenced in the files of teaching materials in series II.

### Subseries I.1: Research, 1950-2007

### **Scope and Contents**

Subseries I.1 includes Waltz's reading notes, folders of articles, and newspaper clippings. Two boxes in this subseries comprise his vertical file, in which he kept printouts and clippings of articles alphabetized, usually by author. The rest of the files are labeled by their subject, covering theories and concepts of international relations, organizations, key terms, and areas of the world. A set of alphabetically filed, typed reading notes appear to be from Waltz's graduate work in the early 1950s, while the rest of the material was collected in the course of his scholarly career between the late 1950s and early 2000s.
