He was also a member of the Board of Directors at Physicians for Human Rights from 1988 to 1996, as well as a member of its Advisory Board

from 1987 to 1988, Treasurer and member of the Executive Committee from 1994 to 1996, and Co-chair of the Fundraising Committee from 1994 to 1996. In both organizations he contributed his medical expertise to study and campaign against chemical and biological warfare.
