A leader of the Kadet party of Russia, who was very active in emigre social and political life in Paris in the 1920s and 1930s.

Summary

The collection consists of correspondence, manuscripts, documents, subject files, and printed materials that concern emigre educational and political groups in Europe. Most of the collection deals with the Central Committee to Secure Higher Education for Russian Youth Abroad (Tsentralńyĭ Komitet po Obezpecheniiū Vysshego Obrazovaniia Russkomu

Tūnoshestvu za Granitsei), which Fedorov headed. There are also materials on the Union of Russian Students in France (Soiūz Russkikh Studentov vo Frantsii), for 1921-22; the Russian National Committee (Russkii Natsionalńyi Komitet), of which Fedorov was vice-president; the journal "Borba za Rossiiū" which he edited; and the Commission to Coordinate the Activity of Russian Organizations Aiding the Unemployed (Komissiiā po Soglasovaniiū Deiātelńosti Russkikh Organizatsii, Okazyvaiūshchikh Pomoshch Bezrabotnym), which he chaired. Cataloged correspondents in the collection include Aleksandr Kizevetter, Semen Frank, Sergei Rakhmaninov, and Petr Struve.
