He was for many years an associate of Thomas Wittemore in the Committee for the Education of Russian Youth in Exile and worked in the library of the American Byzantine Institute in France.

Summary

Correspondence, manuscripts, photographs, a subject file, and printed materials collected by Ermolov. The collection almost exclusively concerns the 1917 Revolution and the Civil War. Correspondence includes items by Isabel Hapgood and Konstantin Nabokov. The manuscripts include English-language translations of Russian materials from the period. There are 2 photographs: 1 of Grigorii Rasputin at a tea party in 1916, and the other of the State Duma in
