Ivan Koshko was appointed governor of Penza in 1907 and of Perm' in 1911. Arkadiĭ Koshko was a famous detective, author of "Ocherki ugovnogo mira TSarskoĭ Rossii."

Summary

Memoirs of the Koshko family, specifically Ivan Frantsevich, his brother Arkadiĭ, his son Boris, and his daughter Olġa. Almost all of the memoirs are in the hand of Olġa Koshko. Ivan's memoirs (partially published) touch on his government service in Samara, Novgorod, Penza, and Perm' and his experiences during the 1917 Revolution and Civil War. The excerpt from Arkadiĭ's memoirs concern the Beilis ritual murder case. Boris Koshko's memoirs concern his

experiences as an Imperial and Provisional government official during World War I. Olga Koshko's memoirs deal with her father and with life in the emigration in Europe.
