## Biographical sketch

---

In 1948 Loebel was Czechoslovak Minister of Foreign Trade; in 1949 he was arrested and 3 years later was tried in the Slansky show trials. He was eventually released from prison, and in 1968 came to the United States. In the United States he has taught economics (at Vassar) and written extensively on economics and world affairs; his best known book is "My Mind on Trial."

Correspondence, manuscripts, subject files and printed materials of Eugen Loebel. Correspondence includes letters from prominent national figures such as William F. Buckley, Hubert Humphrey, Henry Kissinger and Harrison Salisbury. There are many manuscripts by Loebel from the 1970s and 1980s and subject files on economics, Czechoslovakia and East-West

relations. Printed materials include clippings and short pieces by and about Loebel, and copies of four books by him.
