Zemstvo chief (zemskii nachal'nik) who after the Civil War emigrated to Yugoslavia and worked in the Yugoslavian judicial system.

Scope and Content

The collection consists of manuscripts, memoirs and a printed item. Manuscripts consist of poems by Maïborodov, including a typescript of a poema entitled "Bogdan Khmel'niĭskii." The memoirs primarily concern the years 1900-1938 and include Maïborodov's reminiscences as a student at St. Petersburg University (1900-1904) and his reminiscences of his service as a zemstvo chief in the Volynian, Podolian, Bessarabian and Kherson provinces from 1904-1916. The printed item is an off-print (61 p.) of a memoir entitled "S frantsuzami," which was published in "Arkhiv Russkoï Revol'iutsii." In the collection it is part of the memoir "Vo vremia smuty (pri vremennom pravitel'stve) [1917-1920]."
