## Biographical sketch

---

Professor of financial law at St. Petersburg and Kharkov Universities and advisor to Witte, Stolypin, and Kokovtsov in the last years of the monarchy. Migulin was the author of a number of books on Russian finance and economics, including "Agrarnyj Vopros" (Kharkov, 1906) and "Nasha Bankovaia Politika (1729-1903)" (Kharkov, 1904).

## Scope and Content

---

Cataloged correspondence includes one or two letters each from Nikolai Astrov, Vladimir Kokovtsov, Evgraf Kovalevskii, and Grand Duke Vladimir Kirillovich. There are also many letters from Migulin's sister in Leningrad from 1922-1938. Manuscripts by Migulin deal with financial and agrarian policies of the Tsarist and Soviet governments, the Russo-Japanese War, the causes of the Revolution, and reign of Nicholas II. There are materials concerning the education of Russian children in emigration in France, and printed materials which consist of an issue of "Chasovoï," some offprints and clippings.
