The wife of A.A. Miller, a marshal of the nobility and last president of the city of Warsaw until 1915. Elena Miller emigrated to France where she took an active part in emigre monarchist and religious organizations.

Summary

The collection consists of correspondence, manuscripts, a document, and printed materials. Cataloged materials include two poems by Igor' Severiānin, Elena Miller, and letters from Nikolaï K. Roerich to Father Georgiï Spasskiï. Correspondence contains mostly letters to Elena Miller, and also includes letters to Archimandrite Afanasii and others. There is also a letter dated 1919 from abbot (igumen) Serafim of the Belogorskiï monastery to Grand Prince Nikolaï Nikolaevich, describing the conditions and mood of the peasants in the Perm' area. Manuscripts are by various persons on religious and political topics. Printed materials consist primarily of monarchist and religious mimeographed materials, fliers and pamphlets.
