Imperial and White army officer who served during World War II in the Russkii Okhrannyi Korpus (Russian Defense Corps) in Yugoslavia and later a displaced person in Austria.

Summary

Nikolaev's memoirs discuss his service in the White Army, the Russian Defense Corps, and the camp in Kellerberg, Austria after World War II. Another manuscript is entitled "Deistviia Russkago Okrannago Korpusa v Serbii, 1941-45 gg." Manuscripts and memoirs by others largely concern General Lavr Kornilov. There is a subject file on the "Sodruzhestvo Lienĭs" (Lienz agreement). Printed materials include a mimeographed pamphlet "Kratkii obzor zhizni i deiatel'nosti russkoĭ gruppy v lagere Kellerberg."
