Scope and Content

The papers contain correspondence, reports, and financial records. The materials almost entirely date from 1919-22 and concern the Civil War and its immediate aftermath. There are several letters from General Nikolaï Tudenich to Pilkin, and many letters and reports which passed between Pilkin and his assistants. The majority of the collection is made up of financial records, such as income and disbursements for the "Morskaiâ organizatsiia" in Paris (1919-22), and the "Morskoï fond" in Helsinki (1920-24); and subsidies disbursed to White naval personnel living in Estonia (1920-23).
