Summary

The collection consists of correspondence, manuscripts and memoirs, documents, minutes of meetings, financial records, photographs, maps, and printed materials. Cataloged correspondents include Grand Duke Nikolaĭ Nikolaevich and General Petr Wrangel. Manuscripts include memoirs by Konstantin Rozen on his military service from 1902-1917, and a memoir by F. N. Buīak entitled "Vospominaniīa starogo kavalergarda 1885-1902." Subject files are on Kadry Voĭsk Ofitserov (Cadres of Military Officers) in Belgrade and Soīuz Russkikh

Ofitserov (Union of Russian Officers), emigre Russian military organizations. Documents concern Rozen's family and estate in Vitebsk province. Minutes of meetings concern the Kavalergardskaīa Semīa (Cavalry Guard Family). Financial records cover the fundraising activities of Soīuz Russkikh Ofitserov and the estate. Photographs are of the estate, and maps are of the Vitebsk region and the estate grounds. Printed materials concern the estate and the above mentioned military organizations, and include copies of the news bulletin"Vestnik Kavalergardskoĭ Semī.".
