A White Army general, Sakharov served in both the Russo-Japanese War and World War I. In the Civil War he was a commanding officer under Admiral Kolchak. Sakharov emigrated to Germany after the war.

Summary

The collection consists of manuscripts, clippings and books. The manuscripts include a biography of Sakharov and a bibliography of his works, both written by his wife. There is also an essay by Sakharov "Die Herrgottsbienen;" newspaper clippings and two books written by Sakharov "Die tschechischen Legionen in Sibirien" (Berlin, 1936) and "Der verratene Arme" (Berlin, 1938).
