Summary

Manuscripts and subject files of Vladimir N. Timchenko-Ruban. Timchenko-Ruban's memoirs"Stranitsy proshlago" discusses his childhood, his service in the Preobrazhenskii Regiment, World War I, the 1917 Revolution and Civil War, and his life in France from 1922 and through the period of German occupation during World War II. Timchenko-Ruban's essay "1683-1958" concerns the history of the Preobrazhenskii Regiment. There are two subject files containing documents inherited by Timchenko-Ruban. One file relates to Sofia Danilova and contains school and Red Cross documents while the other relates to Semen Lazarev and his wife Olga (n'ee Mikhailova) and contains school, travel and military documents. The documents in both files primarily date from the 1880-1920 period.
