Summary

Correspondence of I.L. Tolstoï. Nearly all the correspondence is between Il'ia Tolstoï and his wife, Nadezhda Klement'evna Tolstaïa. It primarily dates from the 1920s and concerns the

lecture series Il'ia Tolstoï gave throughout the United States and in Paris. There is one letter from Aleksandra L. Tolstaïa and a folder of official correspondence relating to the lecture series, including several letters from Tolstoï's manager. There is a brief essay by Tolstoï entitled "A Democratic Peace" and an unidentified photograph, presumably of Nadezhda Tolstaïa.
