Summary

Manuscripts of Ukraintsev. The manuscripts are chiefly autobiographical in nature, and cover the 1905-1955 period. Among the topics Ukraintsev treats are: the 1905 Revolution; pogroms in Kishinev; the St. Petersburg-Petrograd Military District (Voennyi Okrug), with which Ukraintsev was associated from 1914 to 1917; Ukraintsev's service with the White Army on the southern front; his service as an interpreter for German troops in the USSR in 1941; Adolph Hitler; and the ten years Ukraintsev spent in Soviet prison camps following his arrest by SMERSH in Poland, 1945.
