Summary

Correspondence, manuscripts, diaries, documents, subject files and printed materials of Vorobev. Following the 1917 Revolution, Vorobev emigrated to Constantinople, Belgrade, and eventually to Nice. The correspondence dates from 1920 to 1950. The manuscripts primarily concern ethnography, agriculture and horticulture in the Black Sea region, and approximately half the manuscripts are by Vorobev himself. In addition, there are several diaries (dating from the 1940's) in which Vorobev recorded his professional activities. The documents include a number of contracts and receipts. The subject files cover a variety of topics including antisemitism, flora in the Kuban River region, notes on the "dance of death" and the Obshchestvo okhraneniia russkikh kulturnykh tsennostei (the Society for the

Preservation of Russian Cultural Antiquity) in Paris, of which Vorobev was secretary. Among the printed materials are articles, clippings and maps.
