Summary

The collection consists entirely of personal papers including correspondence, manuscripts, and miscellaneous materials, most of which pertain to Davis' family. The most interesting parts of the collection are Davis' letters from Russia, 1916-1919, which contain his observations on

the Russian Revolution, and Davis' short story and play manuscripts, none of which were ever published.
