Includes a review of George Simpson's translation of Emile Durkheim's On the Division of Labor in Society, sent to the Columbia Law Review in 1935.

Scope and Contents	
Includes "Expose des Titres de Emile Durkheim" with Durkheim's annotations. Note says "Revised by Professor Durkheim Sept. 1913 and sent to C.E. Gehlke at that time." There are also Columbia materials: Gehlke's Faculty of Political Science Registration Book, with his courses completed and the signatures of the instructors, 1908-1911; Gymnasium Manual and a form with the "Average Measurements of 790 Columbia students, 17, 18 and 19 Years Old" and Gehlke's measurements filled in, 1908; brochure of scholarships awarded in 1908-1909; annual commencement program, 1914; and a questionnaire sent out to Sociology students as part of a dissertation research (completed but not mailed in), 1963.
