## **Biographical / Historical**

Born in Glen Lock, Pennsylvania on January 15, 1873, Mary E. Lewis became the third wife of William Ambrose Shedd [1865-1918], Presbyterian missionary to Persia and later United States consul in Uremia, in July 1917. They had known one another for fourteen years and had lived as missionary associates at Uremia prior to their marriage.

## **Biographical / Historical**

The Shedds were forced to evacuate Uremia on July 31, 1918, along with thousands of other Assyrian Christians, as the Ottoman Army threatened nearby. They retreated for six days, at which point her husband became ill with cholera and died shortly thereafter. Mrs. Shedd's group escaped further from the warzone towards Iraq with the aid of the British, and buried her husband along the way, about seven miles east of Sain Kala. Mary Lewis Shedd reached Hamadan on August 24. On October 2, she wrote that probably seven or eight thousand died, were killed, or were taken prisoner on the journey she had recently completed.

Formerly part of the independent Missionary Research Library (MRL), these records were donated by Mrs. Robert E. Speer. They were later moved with the MRL to the Brown Memorial Tower of Union Theological Seminary in 1929, and accessioned by the Burke Library at the time of the MRL's closure in 1976.

#### **Processing Information**

The journal was cataloged by Lynn A. Grove on 1988-07-18. Materials were placed in new acid-free folders and boxes, and the journal cover was wrapped in tissue and tied with acid-free cotton tying tape. The finding aid was created by Brigette Kamsler in 2011 with the support of the Henry Luce Foundation, and edited by Leah Edelman in 2020.
