Biographical / Historical

Joseph P. Mullinix joined Columbia University in 1983 as Vice Provost for academic planning and resource management and the following year was appointed Senior Vice President, responsible for planning and budget activities, and personnel and facilities operations. Starting in 1991 he was also the University's Chief Financial Officer, overseeing the Treasurer and Controller, investments, internal audit, institutional real estate and project development.

Biographical / Historical

Before Columbia, Mullinix was a senior financial analyst at Goldman Sachs. From 1972 to 1981 he served the Executive Office of the President of the United States, holding a succession of positions in the Office of Management and Budget, the last as deputy associate director. He earned an AB in economics from Georgetown University and an MBA from the University of Chicago Graduate School of Business.
